Defense V: Leads vs Suit Contracts

Let's take a look at common situations where another suit besides trump has been bid.

Partner's Suit

If partner <u>overcalled or opened</u>, her suit commands priority unless you have one of the top three choices. Guidelines when leading partner's suit:

- 1. If you have <u>not</u> supported partner's suit, make a standard lead, e.g. xxx<u>x</u>, xx<u>x</u>, xx.
- 2. If you have supported partner's suit, lead high from holdings without an A, K or Q; lead low when holding at least three card support and an K or Q. Do not underlead the Ace if you have it.
- 3. With any doubleton lead the higher card.¹

Opponent's Outside Suit

Avoid leading a non-trump suit bid if it is Declarer's second suit or Responder's 2/1 suit, e.g. if Responder bid 2♣ over 1♥, prefer an unbid suit.

Trump

If Responder took a preference or partner has not bid or you don't have one of the top three choices, chose a safe trump lead. Qx(x) or Jx(x) are not safe.

Differences From Notrump Leads

- With KQTx(x) or KQx(x), lead the King
- Lead the lowest from xxx(x)
- Do not underlead Aces

¹ Except AK, where you lead the K.
