

# Hand Evaluation I

This is a 1-page summary of a recommended Point Count System for advancing players. It is slightly more aggressive than Seagram's, as it counts length and shortness for dummy after a fit is found. Refinements may be added in future editions.

## Process:

1. Initial valuation: Add HCP and Length points; make Adjustment(s)
2. After fit is found: Add for Shortness and extra Declarer trump length

## Hand Evaluation (HE) System:

Initial Valuation	
HCP	A=4, K=3, Q=2, J=1
Length	+1 for each card in suit over 4
Adjust +1	Adjust -1
4441	4333
3+ Aces	No Ace*
4 of 5 top honors in suit	Unprotected K, Q or J
3+Tens	4 or more points in Qs & Js*
Declarer (Longer Trump) Reevaluation	
6 <sup>th</sup> or more in trump suit	+1 for each, e.g. KQxxxx = 5+1+2+2=10 HE
Shortness	Doubleton: +1, Singleton: +2, Void: +3
Dummy (Shorter Trump) Reevaluation	
Shortness	Subtract shortest suit length from trump length

\*Omit if Partner opens 1NT, 2NT or 2C

## Opening Hands:

- Open Rule of 20 hands (all seats)
- Open all 15 HCP balanced hands with 1NT
- Open light in third seat (10-11 points) when:
  - ✓ enjoying favorable vulnerability and wanting your suit led
  - ✓ holding 7+cards in the majors.
