Leads versus NT II

This is a continuation of the previous lesson¹ where the bidding was 1NT - 3NT, except in this lesson there might be a Stayman bid or partner may have opened or the opponents ended in 3NT. Questions to help you choose a lead are: (a) What's my strength and partner's likely strength? (b) What do we know about the opponents' hands? Generally, we still favor majors over minors.

Suggested Lead Priority

- □ Safe honor sequence: <u>KQJ(x)</u>, <u>QJT(x)</u>, <u>JT98(x)</u> or Partner's suit: xxxx, xxx, xx
- ☐ 5-card major (4th best)
- \Box 4+ card suit headed by K $\underline{\mathbf{Q}}$ Tx(x), $\underline{\mathbf{Q}}$ J9x(x), $\underline{\mathbf{J}}$ T8x(x)
- □ 4 card major suit without an honor: xxxx
- □ 3/2 card major without an honor: **x**xx, **x**x
- □ 3/4 card major with an A or K: Axx, Axxx, Kxx, Kxxx

Partner Opens; Opponents Bid 3NT Without Stayman

Partner opens a minor and the bidding proceeds 1 - 1NT - P - 3NT. Here's what we know: Partner has an opening hand without a 5-card major; the opponents have 24+HCP; neither opponent typically has a 5-card major. If you have a 5-card major with an honor and a possible outside entry, 4^{th} best of the major will likely be your most effective choice.

E.g. 1 - 1NT – P – 3NT with 2T753 4K92 4843 85 lead the 55. However, with 4T753 4942 4843 4T8 lead the 88. Note: Lead 3Rd best from xxx or Hxx unless you have a sequence.

If Partner opens a major, now you want to lead Partner's suit unless you only have a singleton <u>and</u> an honor sequence in an outside suit.

E.g. $1 \lor - 1$ NT - P - 3NT with $4 \lor Q$ JT73 $4 \lor Q$ 2 $4 \lor Q$ 75 lead the $4 \lor Q$ 0. However, with $4 \lor Q$ T73 $4 \lor Q$ 5 $4 \lor Q$ 75 lead the $4 \lor Q$ 9.

Leading After "Failed" Stayman

In the sequence 1NT - 2 - 3NT Responder has shown at least one major, which somewhat reduces the advantage a major suit lead holds over a minor suit.

After the auction above, you hold: ♠JT7 ♥96 ♦KJ94 ♣9832. Here, the ♠J is the choice. However, with ♠J7 ♥JT75 ♦QJT94 ♣K8 the minor suit with a solid honor sequence headed by the ♦Q is superior.
