

Getting to Know... Ken Gamble

There are few people in the bridge club who are as recognizable as the renowned Ken Gamble. Always joking, and smiling, Ken is an expert bridge player and an institution around the club. He always has a kind word or joke for everyone.

Ken is a native Californian. Born and raised in Compton, his parents moved to San Diego where he attended El Capitan High School. A talented young musician, Ken played both the clarinet and the saxaphone. He enjoyed being in the high school marching band. He excelled in the physical sciences in high school, and as an undergrad, attended San Diego State, majoring in physics, optics and lasers. With his newly aquired BS degree, he found a job as a consultant software engineer. He needed to learn to program, using Fortran for this new job, hence, Ken was propelled to return to SDSC for one summer and learn programming language. With this new ability he found himself a job in Palo Alto at an aerospace company in 1974. He was successful, enjoyed his job, and worked there for forty years until his retirement.

Ken learned to play Whist, a form of bridge in 1969, from a college friend. This play migrated into Goren-style duplicate bridge the following year. Ken has been playing bridge for forty-four years.

Ken met his wife Vicki in a knockout bridge event in 1992 at the Palm Springs Regional. In 1993, they developed a bridge partnership and married later that same year. They played live tournament bridge together for about five years. Together, they walked their cocker spaniel around Mountain View and later Capitola. When Vicki's health began to deteriorate from a chronic illness, they took their bridge game on line. Eventually, Vicki's poor health stopped her from playing at all.

Ken is sort of a newcomer to Santa Cruz. He didn't move to Capitola until 2000. Ken resisted Vicki's persistent requests to move out of Mountain View. Vicki wanted to be by the ocean, to walk their dog and enjoy the views. Ken did not want to be around the "strange hippie culture" of Santa Cruz.

Ken believes he joined the bridge club a few years after their move to Santa Cruz because he and Vicki played so many tournaments, and his work didn't allow time for day games. In 2012, after retirement, Ken began playing on a more frequent basis at the club. Ken, being an excellent player, had no trouble finding partners at the club.

What makes Ken happiest about bridge? Ken has a passion for the game; it's in his blood, he says. He loves the challenge.

Ken's advice to new players is to develop your skills on line. Spend time reading books, put in the effort to learning on your own. Make mistakes, sometimes the best way to learn is through your own mistakes. Every hand is unique and perhaps played differently throughout the room.

Ken's ancedotal story is a bridge player's fairy tale. For many years, Ken and his best friend traveled to Hawaii for a regional bridge tournament. In 1993, Vicki joined them. On the very **first** day of competition, Ken seized the moment and proposed to Vicki. They managed to plan and execute a wedding on the **final** day of the tournament. The ceremony and dinner were attended by thirty fellow bridge players gathered on the roof of the Hilton Hotel. Held between the morning and evening bridge sessions, it was a race against the clock for thirty people to scamper (like mice) back to the evening session for tournament play. Except for the glass slipper, truly a Cinderella story.

If the director determines that there was an unacceptable behavior, director may assign the offending pair disciplinary penalty.

Let's remember to be a GOOD PARTNER and GOOD OPPONENT

- 1. Do not give lessons, unless you are being paid to do so.
- 2. Never say anything to your partner unless you would want him to say the same to you.
 If you are unsure whether to say something, don't.
- 3. Never "result" (criticize your partner for a normal action just because it did not work this time).




Newcomer Liaison **Shamim Formoso**
